In order to provide a friendly, supportive environment, TDF has held sensitivity training sessions for the entire Belasco house staff and cast of *How to Dance in Ohio*.

In addition, TDF has trained volunteers, many of whom are professional autism specialists, assisting the house staff (e.g., ushers, security team) and available throughout the performance to assist you.

Break Areas will be staffed with our TDF volunteers who are autism specialists. They will be located in the theatre lobbies.

Additional trained volunteers will be accessible throughout the performance to assist you.

Parents and Caretakers

We strongly encourage parents and caretakers to be aware of any early warning signs of difficult behavior and act accordingly. Our trained volunteers are ready and willing to help however they can.

NOT ALLOWED in the theatre:

Flash photography and videography are NOT PERMITTED inside the theatre.

We want to enjoy the show while still respecting the theatre's policies.

TDF will have a professional photographer on site taking flash photos to be used on social media sites.
